SPONSORED RIDE AT THE BALMORAL ESTATE

Don't miss this fantastic opportunity to explore the magnificent Balmoral Estate and discover the Beauties of Lochnagar, the old military road and the ancient Caledonian forest whilst raising funds for the British Horse Society equine grass sickness campaign.

Follow the signposted route for a self-guided ride suitable for all ages and levels, although children under 14 need to be accompanied by an experienced adult. Full directions, maps, sponsorship forms and additional joining instructions (including start times) will be sent out before the event. There is a choice of 2 routes:

Route A: around 15km, with riders starting between 10.00am and 12noon approx

Route B: around 5km, with riders starting between 12noon and 2.00pm approx

Riders to return to start by 5pm — all finishers will receive a rosette and goody bag.

Entries: £30 per rider to be paid on booking, plus a minimum £30 in sponsorship paid on the day. Entries limited to 100 on a first come, first served basis and must be received by Friday 16 May.

BALMORAL ESTATE SPONSORED RIDE CONDITIONS OF ENTRY

- All riders must wear hard hats with a fixed harness to a minimum standard of PAS015:1998 or 2011, BSEN1384:1997 or 2012, EN1384:1996 at all times whilst mounted and suitable footwear must be worn. Body protectors are strongly recommended and should be BETA level 3.
- Riders aged 14 and under must be accompanied on the ride by a responsible and suitably experienced adult.
- All horses / ponies to be 4 years or over.
- It is the rider's responsibility to ensure their horse is fit and healthy enough to complete the chosen distance comfortably. Please be sensible—if your horse or a horse in your stables has been ill in the month running up to the event please don't come along. The horse's passport and a current valid vaccination certificate must be brought on the day otherwise entry may be refused.
- Instructions of organisers, officials and stewards must be followed to promote the safety of everyone present.
- For safety reasons, riders to start in groups of at least 2 and no more than 6.
- The routes incorporate some roadwork so reflective clothing must be worn on horse and rider.
- All riders are expected to follow the Scottish Outdoor Access Code and must expect to open and close gates on the route.
- All riders must wear a map holder for the route description (which will be available at the start).
- Vet and farrier on call, but not on site. First aid on site.
- Please leave the parking area as you found it—don't muck out your trailer or lorry in the parking area, and take your dung home with you. Thank you!
- Save for death or personal injury caused by the negligence of the organisers or anyone for whom they are in law responsible, neither the organisers of any event to which these rules apply, nor British Horse Society Scotland nor the Balmoral Estate nor any agent, employee, representative of these bodies accepts liability for any accident, loss, damage, injury or illness to horses, owners, riders, spectators, land or any other person or property whatsoever, whether caused by their negligence, breach of contract or in any other way whatsoever.
